On Thursdays we have open and tournament chess. There will also be classes on how to play chess for those new to the game and advanced classes for those who want to improve their chess playing skills.

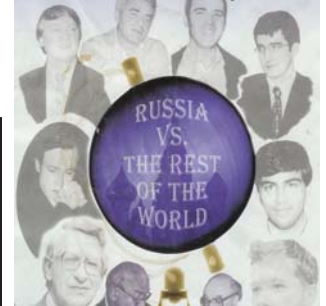
